ARREST: At 3:07 am on April 16th Mount Laurel Police conducted a motor vehicle stop on Route 38 near Hartford Road. During the stop officers arrested Michael L. Framo, age 25, of Hainesport, NJ. He was charged with driving while intoxicated and released pending a court hearing.

COUNTERFIET MONEY: At 12:45 pm on April 17th a subject used a counterfeit \$20.00 bill to make a purchase at the Burger King on Route 38. The crime is still under investigation.

CRIMINAL MISCHIEF: At 7:00 am on April 17th an employee who works at a business at 127 Ark Road reported someone had slashed the tire on his bicycle. The victim parked his bicycle in front of the business while he worked the overnight shift and found the damage in the morning.

ARREST: At 7:16 pm on April 17th Mount Laurel Police conducted a motor vehicle stop on Ark Road near Route 38. During the stop officers arrested Roy G. Garcia, age 36, of Hainesport, NJ. He was arrested for an outstanding warrant and found in possession of marijuana. He was charged with possession of less than 50 grams of marijuana nad released pending a court hearing after satisfying the warrant.

BURGLARY: Mount Laurel Police responded to a residential burglary on the 200 block of Tam O'Shanter Road report on April 17th. The investigation revealed that someone entered the residence by removing a screen from an unlocked window sometime between April 15th and April 17th. The residence was ransacked however; it did not appear anything was taken.

ATTEMPTED BURGLARY: While investigating the previous burglary officers discovered someone attempted to pry open a rear window and also damaged a motion sensor light. The attempt was made some time between April 15th and April 17th. No entry was gained into the residence.

BURGALRY: At 9:27 pm on April 17th Mount Laurel Police responded to an activated burglar alarm at a residence on the unit block of Village Lane. The investigation revealed that someone broke a sliding glass door and entered the residence. It could not be determined if anything was stolen.

ARREST: At 12:00 am on April 19th Mount laurel Police responded to a burglary at the Sunoco service station, 3240 Route 38. An employee witnessed a suspect enter the garage area and steal money. The investigation identified a suspect and officers arrested Michael M. Cozzoli, age 29, of Mount Laurel. He was charged with burglary and theft. Bail was set at \$10,000.00 with no 10% option and he was committed to the Burlington County Jail.

OVERDOSE REVERSAL: At 8:23 pm on April 20th Mount Laurel Police responded to the report of an unresponsive person in a vehicle in the parking lot of 200 Larchmont Boulevard. The arriving officer quickly determined that the 23 year old male from Mount Holly had overdosed on heroin. The officer administered Narcan and revived the victim. He was transported to the hospital by Mount Laurel EMS for further treatment.

ARREST: At 10:17 pm on April 20th Mount Laurel Police located a suspicious occupied vehicle in Spencer Park, Ramblewood Parkway. During the investigation officers arrested Sean P. Kelly, age 26, of Mount Laurel. He was charged with possession of less than 50 grams of marijuana and released pending a court hearing.

ARREST: At 11:07 pm on April 21st Mount Laurel Police conducted a motor vehicle stop on Fellowship Road near Route 73. During the stop officers arrested Timothy E. Smith, age 48, of Voorhees, NJ. He was charged with driving while intoxicated and released pending a court hearing.
