CRIMINAL MISCHIEF: A resident of the 1600 block of Larchmont Place reported his vehicle was scratched during the overnight hours of January 12th into the 13th.

ARREST: On January 13th at 3:15 pm Mount Laurel Police arrested Preston Thomas, age 29, of Camden, NJ. Thomas turned himself in at police headquarters as part of the investigation into counterfeit money used at Wegman's on December 28th. He was charged with conspiracy to commit forgery and released after posting bail.

THEFT: A resident on Brookwood Road reported they discovered jewelry missing from a bedroom on January 12th. No forced entry was made to the residence. A moving company had been on location during the time of the theft.

ARREST: On January 13th at 11:03 am Mount Laurel Police responded to the ShopRite on Nixon Drive for a shoplifting report. During the investigation officers arrested Yan Lin, age 36, of Mount Laurel. He attempted to steal \$53.00 worth of merchandise. He was charged with shoplifting and released pending a court hearing.

BURGLARY: A resident on the 100 block of Willow Turn reported that someone stole a TV and bicycle from an unlocked garage between January 13th and 14th.

THEFT: A guest at a hotel on Atrium Way reported prescription medication was stolen from his room on January 14th between 7:50 am and 5:00 pm. No forced entry to the room was made.
